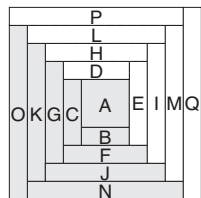


SORBET LOG CABIN

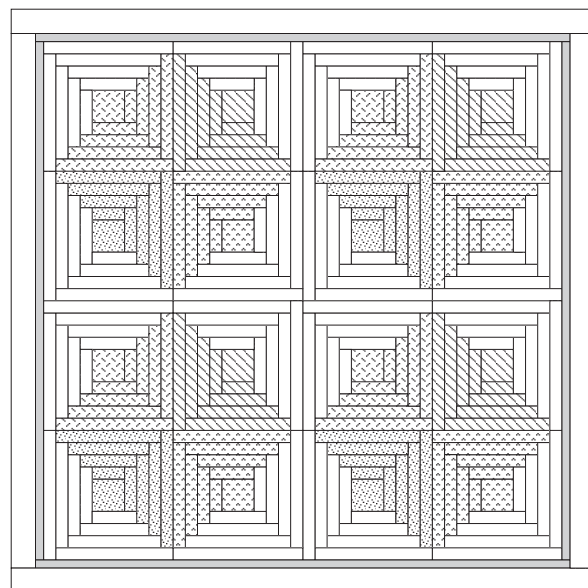

Finished size 39" x 39"

The pastel version of Florentina was used for two sides of the log cabin with a bright pastel used for the other two sides of the block. Four different bright pastels were chosen to create a larger image



with the four blocks joined together. This measures 16" finished. Yardage amounts are given for the quilt pictured. By making more blocks this could fit a bed. Make the necessary adjustments for any bed size. Finished block size is 8." Strip width is 3/4" finished.



Sorbet Log Cabin – Materials Needed and Cutting Instructions

(all measurements based on accurate cutting, 1/4" seam allowance, and 42" wide strips)

1/3 yard of four different solid like prints for A, B, C, F, G, J, K, N, & O (There are four different colors so fabric could be stacked and four cut at once.)	From each color cut: 4 - 2 1/2" x 2 1/2" square for the centers (A) 4 - 1 1/4" x 2 1/2" (B) 4 - 1 1/4" x 3 1/4" (C) 4 - 1 1/4" x 4" (F) 4 - 1 1/4" x 4 3/4" (G) 4 - 1 1/4" x 5 1/2" (J) 4 - 1 1/4" x 6 1/4" (K) 4 - 1 1/4" x 7" (N) 4 - 1 1/4" x 7 3/4" (O)
1 1/4 yards Pastel Florentina print for D, E, H, I, L, M, P, & Q	16 - 1 1/4" x 3 1/4" (D) 16 - 1 1/4" x 4" (E) 16 - 1 1/4" x 4 3/4" (H) 16 - 1 1/4" x 5 1/2" (I) 16 - 1 1/4" x 6 1/4" (L) 16 - 1 1/4" x 7" (M) 16 - 1 1/4" x 7 3/4" (P) 16 - 1 1/4" x 8 1/2" (Q)
1/8 yard for first border	Cut 2 - 1" x 32 1/2" strips for the sides and 2 - 1" x 33 1/2" strips for top and bottom
5/8 yard for second border and binding	Cut 2 - 3 1/2" x 33 1/2" strips for the sides and 2 - 3 1/2" x 39 1/2" strips for top and bottom
1 1/4 yards for backing	
45" x 45" batting	

Sorbet Log Cabin Sewing Instructions

To make the blocks, lay B on top of A, stitch along one edge using a 1/4" seam allowance. Press seam allowance toward B.

Press seam allowance toward B.

Layer AB and C right sides together.

Feed the layers through the sewing machine. Press toward C.

Continue this process until you have the block completed.

To speed up the process you can construct several blocks at once, feeding one after the other through the machine.

Make four blocks of each color.

Arrange as shown and stitch together in rows. Join row 1 to row 2, etc.

Add borders sides first, then top and bottom.

Layer and finish the quilt.
